COACHING EXPECTATIONS

Please remember that this may be a child's first time participating in youth sports. We want this to be a fun, positive, and educational experience.

1. **This is a recreational league** -Provide a safe and fun environment for the children while teaching the fundamentals and good sportsmanship. Learn and follow ALL league rules, policies and procedures.
2. Plan and attend games, practices and events. If you are unable to attend, make sure that you have an assistant coach that is background checked to coach in your absence.
3. Please contact all your players by **FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 13.** *Practices begin the week of FEBRUARY 23.
4. **Ensure all your players and parents/spectators are following all of the rules.**

Coaches Code of Conduct

Our goal for our program is to be a safe and fun environment for all!

- **Officials**- Please adhere to our zero tolerance policy- PLEASE do not yell at or criticize the officials or dispute calls. If you feel the officials are not making the correct calls, address it with the supervisor who can talk to them. These are high school athletes doing their best. If something is not resolved, please email me about the situation.
- **Parent and Player Conduct**- Coaches are responsible for both their parents and players conduct. Coaches need to go over the league rules with parents and players at your first practice to ensure that everyone knows the rules. If parents get out of line, yell at officials etc., coaches need to remind them about good sportsmanship and our zero tolerance policy!
- **Sportsmanship/Good Role Model**- Coaches need to teach good sportsmanship and role model good sportsmanship as well! Coaches should not yell at officials, other coaches or parents! Absolutely no cussing!
- Follow all BSD Policies on School Property- **NO DOGS, NO SMOKING, NO ALCOHOL**
- **Disciplinary Procedures and Penalties**- Any coach, parent, team or player that does not follow the code of conduct will be issued either a written warning, suspension and other penalties.
