VOLUNTEER COACH BACKGROUND CHECK REQUIREMENTS

Coaches must complete and pass an **on-line** National volunteer background check through the Bethel School District at- <https://bethelvolunteers.hrmlplus.net/> before receiving their rosters.

Through this process coaches will also complete the free on-line certification for Sudden Cardiac Arrest and Concussion in Youth Sports through NFHS.
